

Speedy Chicken & Mushroom Casserole

Ingredients

- Oil
- 400g diced chicken breast
- 1 medium brown onion, chopped
- 2 rashers middle bacon, trimmed, chopped
- 250g button mushrooms, quartered
- 1/4 cup plain flour
- 1 tablespoon dijon mustard
- 1 cup chicken stock
- 1/2 cup thickened cream
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley



Method

1. Heat oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add chicken. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until golden. Transfer to a plate.
2. Add onion and bacon to pan. Cook, stirring, for 3 to 4 minutes or until onion has softened. Add mushroom. Cook, stirring for 2 minutes or until mushroom has started to soften. Stir in flour and mustard. Cook, stirring, for 2 minutes. Gradually stir in stock. Bring to the boil. Return chicken to pan. Cover. Reduce heat to low. Simmer for 15 minutes or until chicken is cooked through.
3. Add cream. Season with salt and pepper. Cook, without boiling, for 3 minutes or until heated through. Stir in parsley. Serve.

Golden Syrup Dumplings

Ingredients

- 150g (1 cup) self-raising flour
- 60g unsalted butter, cubed
- 1 egg
- 1-2 tbs milk, to beat
- Thick cream, to serve
- **Syrup**
- 30g butter
- 220g (1 cup) caster sugar
- 4 tbs golden syrup
- 1 small lemon, juiced



Method

1. Sift flour into a bowl, then rub in butter until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Beat egg with a little milk and pour into flour mixture. Combine to form a dough, then divide into small balls.
2. To make the syrup, combine the ingredients together with 1 cup of water in a pan and bring to the boil over medium heat. Carefully add dough balls to syrup and boil for 20 minutes. Serve with syrup and

Ingredients

- 250g dried penne pasta or macaroni
- 20g butter
- 1 tablespoon plain flour
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1 1/2 cups reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated
- 1/4 cup frozen peas
- 1 small red capsicum, finely diced



Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease 6 x 3/4-cup capacity ovenproof ramekins.
2. Cook pasta in a large saucepan of boiling salted water until just tender. Drain and return to saucepan.
3. Melt butter in a small saucepan over high heat. Add flour and cook for 45 seconds. Remove from heat and slowly add milk, stirring constantly. Return to heat and cook, stirring, until sauce comes to the boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 3 minutes. Add 1 cup cheese and stir until well combined and melted.
4. Stir sauce, peas and capsicum through pasta. Spoon into ramekins. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until cheese is golden.

Hearty Beef Casserole

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1.5kg diced beef chuck or blade steak
- 2 large onions, cut into thin wedges
- 2 leeks, white part only, sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 4 sticks celery, trimmed, sliced
- 2 large carrots, peeled, cut into 3cm pieces
- 2 x 425g cans diced tomatoes
- 1/4 cup red wine
- 1 cup beef stock



Method

1. Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a large saucepan over high heat. Cook beef, in 4 batches, stirring, until browned. Transfer to a plate.
2. Reduce heat to medium. Add remaining oil, onions, leeks, garlic, celery and carrots to pan. Cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes.
3. Return beef to pan with tomatoes, wine and stock. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer, covered, for 1 hour. Uncover and simmer gently, stirring occasionally, for 30 minutes or until beef is tender.
4. Divide half the casserole between 4 plates. Serve with mashed potato or bread. Set aside remaining casserole for High Pie (see related recipe). Leftovers Allow reserved casserole to cool. Keep in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 3 days or freeze for up to 3 months.

Father Guy's Bridge

Many of you will remember walking across Father Guy's footbridge or will have heard it mentioned fondly in reminiscences of the past. Charlton's original golf course of 18 holes was located by the Avoca River and actually crossed it in three places. In 1904, the Charlton Parish priest and keen golfer, Father Goidanich (affectionately called Father Guy), was instrumental in the construction of a footbridge due to the log crossing at the 3rd hole often being under water. The bridge was also used by the town's people as a shortcut to the football ground and from Clifton Hill to the railway station. After many years of service, repairs and modifications, the bridge eventually became unsafe and was pulled down in 1971. There is however much more to Father Goidanich than his bridge and his life was quite remarkable.

Edward O'Sullivan Goidanich was born in Cork, Ireland in 1867 and was the only child of Croatian ship's captain, Gabrielle Goidanich and his Irish wife, Arabella O'Sullivan. After completing his studies and being ordained a priest, he arrived in Australia in 1891. He was appointed as the assistant to Fr. Costello of the Charlton Parish which then embraced a huge area as far north as Mildura and included many churches. In 1893 he was sent to Horsham and shortly after that to the Swan Hill Parish. Even though he had only been in Charlton for less than two years, Father Goidanich had already endeared himself to all sections of the community.

In 1900 Father Goidanich returned to Charlton as Parish priest, receiving a large send off from his Swan Hill congregation. Over the next 15 years he worked tirelessly for his parishioners and was instrumental in building churches in Wycheproof, Wooroonook and a new brick church in Charlton. Due to his spiritual guidance the Parish progressed so much that it was eventually divided into five separate parishes

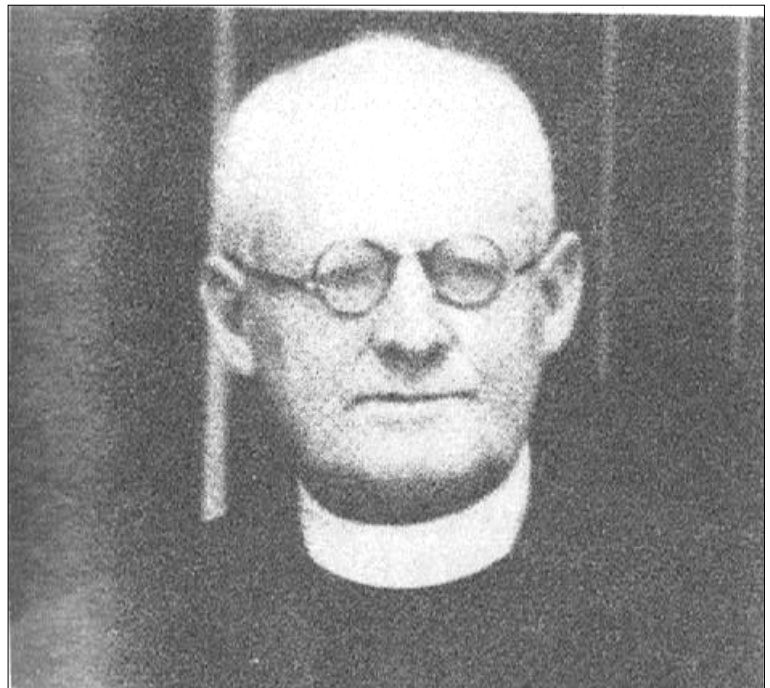
In 1915 Father Goidanich enlisted as one of the first serving chaplains in the Australian Imperial Forces at the age of 48. He served at Gallipoli where he was wounded and on the battle front in France and Flanders. He was known for not staying in the 'back line' and often performed tasks outside the role of chaplain. He was awarded a Military Cross for his consistent good work throughout the operations in France, and was later assigned the special duty of visiting all of the hospitals in the United Kingdom in which Australian soldiers were located. Upon his arrival back in Charlton in 1918, his parishioners presented him with a purse of notes which enabled him to purchase a motor car.

Shortly after returning to Charlton, Father Goidanich was sent to Port Fairy much to the disappointment of the Charlton Parish. The East Charlton Tribune reported on his leaving Charlton with the heading 'Departure of Father Goidanich - Long and Successful Ministry Ends' and stated that he had endeared himself in the hearts of his people and his departure would be a great blow to them. He had shared their grief and participated in their joys, and had at all times proved himself a true friend. He was respected and esteemed by people of all denominations and was particularly popular with the children with plenty of encouragement and kind words.

After serving for 12 years in Port Fairy for which he is mostly remembered for his tireless and fearless work during the pneumonic influenza outbreak, he became successor to the Dean of Ararat in 1930. He spent the next 18 years working with the energy and zeal of a young priest, liquidating the parish debt of 3000 pounds and embarking on many building works to the church and presbytery. In 1946 he was appointed a Domestic Prelate by Pope Pius XII, with the title Monsignor.

On 18th August 1848 after feeling ill for a few days, Monsignor Goidanich passed away suddenly at the age of 82. He was active right up until his last moments and had only just recently visited the Deans of Charlton and Swan Hill. His funeral was the largest ever seen in Ararat and included a number of Charlton residents representing the Charlton Parish. Among the 75 priests present there were two Archbishops and five Bishops. The flags at the War Memorial in Ararat were flown at half mast as a tribute to his memory.

Although Father Guy's Bridge is now gone, the Charlton Golden Grains Museum is planning to erect a plaque in his honour to be unveiled at the 2013 Back-to.






