#### HIGH STREET

Charlton's High Street has many delightful shops and eateries to enjoy. Café's, pubs, clothing, antiques and giftware are in abundance. Walking along the street you will find displays and plaques illustrating the history of the township, as well as a bronze bust and audio history of former Charlton resident, Prime Minister John Curtin.

### **ROTARY PARK & GORDON PARK**

Rotary Park, situated behind the roundabout at the west end of High Street, is a lovely small park beside the river with undercover BBQ facilities, a terrific spiral children's slide and ample picnic seating. A public toilet is located nearby. Gordon Park, located just over the bridge towards Swan Hill, has a large children's playground and skate park.

#### TRAVELLERS REST & CARAVAN PARK

The Travellers Rest, located in the heart of the town, features ample parking for cars and coaches, modern toilets, a playground, bocce court and sheltered barbeque facilities. Located next to the Avoca River, it also features first class en-suites, powered sites and an R.V. Park, all of which impress the most seasoned caravanners. The Avoca River provides opportunities for fishing, yabbying, canoeing or tranquil walks amongst the river red gums and wildlife spotting. Just over the swing bridge, a 500 metre sealed walking track along the river has several interpretive signs highlighting the local birdlife. An extended walk will take you to the Charlton Weir, about 1km from town. See Camping and Caravanning in Buloke, page 22.



### THE REX

The heart of Charlton's High Street is the Rex – an original Art Deco cinema that has been community owned since 2007 and is fully run and operated by dedicated volunteers. As well as weekly screenings of current films and other special events and live performances throughout the year, the Rex hosts the annual Charlton Film Festival in February. ### THE GOLDEN GRAINS MUSEUM & ELLIOTT GARDENS

At the western end of High Street you will find war memorials for the Boer War, WW1, WW2 and the Vietnam War. In the Elliott Gardens a bronze bust and information on Major General Harold 'Pompey' Elliott is located. Pompey was one of WW1s most famous and loved generals and was born and raised in West Charlton. Also located in these gardens is the Golden Grains Museum, housed in the former Mechanics Institute. This award-winning museum has a large collection of memorabilia and photographs dating back to Charlton's early pioneering days.

#### CHARLTON COURTHOUSE GALLERY

Located in the former Charlton Courthouse (1883), this beautifully restored building is now used as a community gallery and meeting place. Decommissioned in 1982, the courthouse is worth visiting just to view the main courtroom with the judge's bench still in situ and the amazing crazed timber ceiling. The gallery is host to a semi-permanent photographic exhibition and regular exhibitions from local and visiting artists.

#### SPORT AND RECREATION

The Charlton Community boasts dozens of excellent sporting clubs and facilities. In the winter months you can enjoy a hot pie and watch country football at Charlton Park on a Saturday afternoon. Harness Racing is another of Charlton's sporting attractions, with regular race meets and the annual Charlton Pacing Cup. Charlton Park is also home to the Charlton Lawn Tennis Club. Facilities include both lawn and hard courts. The club's annual three-day tournament over the Australia Day weekend draws players from across Victoria. In the winter months golfers can enjoy nine holes at the Charlton Park Golf Course or 18 holes amongst beautiful bushland north-west of town on Golf Links Road.

In Gordon Park, just over the bridge you will find the swimming pool, a large playground, skate park and the Charlton Croquet and Bowling Clubs. The park can also be easily accessed via the swing bridge across the Avoca River by walking through the Travellers Rest.

Only 14km west of Charlton are the Wooroonook Lakes – an important source of water in Charlton's early settlement and the site of plenty of fishing, swimming and boating for over 100 years. Excellent facilities include 10 powered caravan sites, an amenities block, BBQ, playground and a pontoon.





Wycheproof is 253 kilometres north-west on the Calder highway from Melbourne the halfway point to Mildura, also approximately halfway to the South Australia border, halfway to Albury-Wodonga region of north-west.

### THE HALF WAY TOWN

Wycheproof at the southern edge of the Mallee is the centre of a rich grain growing area with a major central receiving silo complex, including the Million Bushel silo on the northern edge of town.

#### MT. WYCHEPROOF

Is the smallest registered mountain (43 metres above sea level) in the world. At the base of our mount is a flora and fauna park with emus and at times kangaroos. Perhaps its most notable feature is the railway track running down the middle of Broadway on the Calder Highway – one of only three towns in Australia with on-road rail. Since 1873 the railway line has run through the middle of Broadway, and today the sight of a massive grain train going through town continues to thrill.

WYCHEPROOF is the headquarters for the Buloke Shire, which occupies an area of 8,004 square kilometres, with a population of 6,201 people (2016) census.

WYCHEPROOF also has excellent sports facilities; these are all within walking distance from the town centre. Tourist accommodation is well catered for with modern motel, caravan park and two hotels. A walk along Broadway reveals the local arts and craft shop, supermarket, newsagency, chemists, café, hotels, hardware store, hair and beauty, and the award winning Bakery on Broadway. For the traveller wishing to have a rest, we boast a very picturesque park, with free BBQs, gazebo, playground and bird aviaries. Adjacent to the park is a steam train display complete with turntable etc. The town museum and coin art gallery are two of the many tourist attractions in the town. Our post office & courthouse are both listed by the National Trust. The Airport is rated to the standard required for both Ambulance and commercial flights. For people looking for a friendly place to live we offer a mid summer climate, with a top ranked P-12 college, kindergarten and excellent medical, hospital & aged care facilities.







### LAKE BULOKE

A shallow lake, covering an area of 10,000 hectares when full. During drought it is used as farm land as it is no longer recognisable as a lake. Lake Buloke is home to a range of flora and fauna, including wedge-tailed eagles. It is also the centre for duck hunting during the season.

### LAKE TYRRELL

Victoria's largest salt lake covering 20,860 hectares. Heading north on the Calder Highway, the viewing platform is well signposted on your right-hand side. The Lake environment is host to Mallee reptiles, kangaroos, emus, white-face chats, and an inland gullery.

This ancient lake is dry most of the year although at times it may be covered by shallow water. Evaporation leaves a salt crust which is commercially extracted by the Cheetham Salt Works at the northern end of the lake. Over 100,000 tonnes of salt is extracted from the lake each year. The first recorded salt harvest from Lake Tyrrell was in 1896.

#### LAKE WOOROONOOK

Situated 14km west of Charlton or 30km northeast of Donald on the Borung Highway, the Wooroonook Lake system provides freshwater lakes surrounded by shady eucalypts.

### **TCHUM LAKE**

On the Birchip Wycheproof Road eight kilometres east of Birchip lies the Tchum Lake system. The main lake holds approximately 900 mega-litres of water and is a popular holiday spot for campers and water skiers. • Nature walks

### WATCHEM LAKE

A small lake located west of Watchem on the Warracknabeal road. The lake has camping facilities and is used for water sports. The small island in the centre breaks the waves created by speed boats and makes it a good lake for water skiing. • Water sports (Skiing, Swimming)

### DONALD CARAVAN PARK LAKE

This small lake is ideal for fishing and, with the caravan park situated right on its shores, you can stay for as long as you like.

#### **GREEN LAKE**

Green Lake is a small and very attractive lake in the middle of a wheat-belt area with sandy beaches, powered camping sites, showers and lots of picnic/barbecue areas, bush walks, gum trees and shade.

It is located 10km from Sea Lake along the road to Birchip and has powered sites and facilities for individuals or groups to meet or stay.

The lake is suitable for swimming and limited boating. Bushwalking can be enjoyed around the outskirts of the lake bed and in the adjacent reserve of Mallee and Pine-Buloke woodland.



It is a pleasant resting stop with friendly locals, a charming general store, two peaceful parks, public facilities, petrol at Nullawil Motors and a regular V-Line bus service.

O'Brien Park at the centre of town is home to Nullawil's famous sculptural creation, the Iron Man.


Set within its unique rural landscape, visit and gain a greater appreciation for the true quality of the art work.



Don't let the name and the size of the Town fool you as **Culgoa** is situated right next to the Calder Highway and is the perfect stop over for Caravaners and travellers.



The Town of **Sea Lake** was formed in the early 1890s when farm selectors arrived and the **rail line** was extended north from Wycheproof. Surveying of the township was undertaken when the railway extension was completed in **1895**.

**Sea Lake** became an important service town for the region's farmers. During the 1960s, with a burgeoning economy, the population grew to over 1000 people.



In 2019, Advance Sea Lake Inc was awarded a grant from FRRR (Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal) for our impressive street art walls.





Mallee Rally

**Sea Lake** is home to the second-longest running Off Road event in Australia – the Sea Lake **Mallee Rally**.

First run in 1973, this race gives a huge boost to the **Sea Lake** economy during the Queen's Birthday long weekend in June, attracting hundreds of competitors and crews from all over Australia.

The Rally circumnavigates the famous **Lake Tyrrell**, 88kms of sand, grass, clay and salt.

The **Mallee Rally** is truly a community effort with more than 120 local volunteers on race day and throughout the three day Family Friendly event.

It is all hands on deck as the town's population swells by hundreds.



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In late 2016, **Sea Lake** became an international tourist destination. Sea Lake is home to Victoria's largest salt lake, **Lake Tyrrell**, which spans 51,500 acres.

Visitors are flocking to **Sea Lake** to experience the beautiful reflective photo opportunities that this shallow salt-crusted lake provides.

It would appear that you are walking on water and, at night when the stars are reflected in the shallow water, you might imagine that you are in the middle of the **Milky Way**.

These unique night skies are a photographer's dream. From all over the world, people are trekking to **Lake Tyrrell** to capture the clear skies, beautiful sunsets and sunrises and dense constellations in the night skies.

A new modern interpretative centre is being built at **Lake Tyrrell** to enhance the visitor experience. Boardwalks, sky lounge, walking tracks and signage are all being incorporated in the infrastructure





### **Green Lake Regional Park**

On the Sea Lake-Birchip Road, 10 km from **Sea Lake**, you'll find this peaceful relaxing spot, perfect for camping and bushwalking. **Green Lake** has BBQ areas, toilets, powered-sites, showers, a play area for the kids, signposted bushwalks, and a large range of unique flora and fauna.



### Travellers Rest and Caravan Park




Saturday evenings.

Like nearby Sea Lake, Nandaly sits near Victoria's largest salt lake, Lake Tyrrell. The Cheetham Saltworks here provide local employment, and culinary and industrial salt to the nation. As the salt works are in operation, visitors are encouraged to view Lake Tyrrell from the viewing platform 5km north of Sea Lake.







Donald is located on the Sunraysia Highway, half way between Melbourne and Mildura. Set amongst several lakes and waterways, Donald provides a diverse range of activities and attractions for those that are travelling through the town or staying for a few days.

With a diverse range of accommodation options, which include motels, a caravan park, country pubs or modern self contained units, Donald offers a variety of options for all travellers and budgets.

### KOOKA'S COUNTRY COOKIES

Tucked behind the former meatworks on the Sunraysia Highway south of Donald, Kooka's has a factory outlet with direct biscuit sales to the public and a range of souvenirs.

### DONALD CEMETERY

Donald has a well-maintained cemetery that shows the human history of the town from original settlement days. Located on a rise just to the south of Donald, tours can be arranged if there is enough interest.

### LAKES

Lake Gil Gil is a popular fishing spot and great for observing native bird life and reptiles including long-necked tortoises.

Lake Buloke is fed by the Richardson River. When full it has a huge circumference and can cover up to 10,000 hectares, however it is extremely shallow. When empty it is possible to crop the lake bed and drive across it to investigate the huge wedge-tailed eagles' nests and other flora and fauna

### MT JEFFCOTT RESERVE

Declared a flora and fauna reserve in the 1970s, Mt. Jeffcott is slowly re-establishing its rare flora, including orchids and a unique form of eucalypt. It is home to kangaroos, wallabies, wedge-tailed eagles, goannas and of course snakes. Keep to the track as you climb the mount to avoid disturbance. The view from the top is well worth the climb, and you can return to the carpark for a barbecue and water.

### THE BULLOCK'S HEAD

Located on the Richardson River near the corner of Byrne and Blair Streets you'll find the tree that has intrigued people throughout Donald's history. This natural formation on a dead gum tree is remarkably like a bullock's head. Town wisdom has it that if the bullock takes a drink, the town is in danger from flood waters. The bullock has taken more than a drink on at least two occasions. The 1909 floods and the 2011 floods saw the bullock at risk of drowning, with only the top of his horn showing!

During the long drought at the start of this century, the tree fell down. It has been protected with fibreglass and restored to its original position, and its appearance has been unaltered in this process.

### THE AGRICULTURAL MUSEUM

Hammill Street – part of the Recreation Reserve This museum was established during the 1960s when so many farmers were replacing their aging machinery and cleaning up their farms. It is now rather crowded, but it has been a project of love by many volunteers to restore some of the machinery to full working order.


## COURT HOUSE MUSEUM AND DONALD ARCHIVES

The courthouse is the site of many exhibitions throughout the year, and a repository for many local artefacts. The courthouse museum has been designated as an official Aboriginal Keeping Place. The Archives is one of the best collections in Victoria of local written records, including indexed and bound copies of the Donald Express and the Donald Times newspapers. The Archives also house a very impressive photographic record of the town and its people.

### THE HISTORIC POLICE CAMP

Woods Street. The first police station in the district was established at what was then known as Richardson Crossing, later renamed Donald. This little four-roomed house was built in 1869 at the request of the local squatters to control the drunken behaviour of their shepherds. The house has been restored by volunteers, and the lockup has been rebuilt from two old lockups of the same vintage. Over time, several other buildings have been relocated from farms of the area

The former courthouse at the corner of the five ways junction is now the home of the Birchip History Museum and research archives for those interested in genealogy or local memorabilia. A replica of the Wild Dog Fence, also known as the Netting Fence, provides part of the fence on the South East of the Museum. A section of the original fence remains near Kinnabulla on the Sunraysia Highway.

### THE MALLEE BULL

In the heart of town you'll find many sculptural works, plaques and memorials, the most famous of which is Big Red the Mallee Bull. As early as 1847 cattle that had gone wild and formed their own herds were seen in the area. The cattle adapted to the harsh Mallee climate admirably (like their human counterparts) bringing us the old country adage "Fit as a Mallee Bull". Legend tells of Big Red, the chief bull of the herd who fought off predators. challengers, aboriginal hunters and settlers to rule the dusty plains. Mallee children were kept in their beds at night or from dawdling from school with the threat that Big Red would get them. The legendary bull was a fearsome sight and his roar was heard for miles around. Of course, all legendary tales get exaggerated somewhere along the line, but Big Red lives on as the spirit of the Mallee.

### **TCHUM LAKE**

This popular recreation reserve is about 8km east of the town centre. It's the perfect spot for swimming, boating, water-skiing, fishing and other water sports.
