



Greetings from your local Charlton Golden Grains Museum. It is hard to believe how quickly this year is passing. A very busy month for the volunteers at the museum as life is getting back to some form of normality and we see the return of visitors to our venue. We recently enjoyed a visit from the Charlton Lions Club who popped along after their monthly meeting for a look around and supper. For some it was the first time in the museum for many years. The chat over a cup of tea was very informative with quite bit of reminiscing. Open every Sunday from 11:00am until 3:00pm, or by arrangement with one of the people listed below, why not make time to arrange your visit. Admittance is still a very low \$5, and free for children. Perhaps your local group or organisation would like to have a day or evening outing. Group tours are most welcome, and a cuppa and bite to eat could accompany your visit.

If you are on Facebook or Instagram, make sure to follow us. Our media officer, David, has been busy interviewing volunteers and Markus, our archivist, features in the first episode of a video series. Items in our collection will also be featured. Also look for a special feature in the soon to be launched Charlton Arts & Culture Magazine.

Our great supporters, in the town's Bingo players, recently made the trip to Donald to assist our fundraising efforts and have an enjoyable night out. With mixed fortunes amongst the players, we are very lucky to receive monies whenever we can get a group to visit. Our next trip will be on **Thursday July 21**. Make a note on your calendars and contact one of the museum volunteers to book your spot; everyone is welcome to come along. Other fund raising ideas are in the pipeline and will be advised as details are finalised.

Like so many grass roots organisations, the Charlton Golden Grains Museum is looking for new members to help maintain, archive and assist with our collection and attend during opening hours to the public. You could give as much or as little time each month as you wish and don't need any experience; training will be provided. If you have an interest in history and would like to help preserve items for Charlton's future generations, contact the museum; you will be made most welcome. A simple option to help is to become a 'Friend of the Museum' for just \$20. Every dollar goes towards maintaining and improving our town's collection of important historic items for future generations.

Another way you could support the museum is to have your family's story recorded for future generations. Late last year we introduced a service where you can record your history for us to scan into our digital reference library, and store a copy of the papers, family images or genealogy charts in an A4 size envelope. This is a wonderful opportunity for stories not to be lost, but preserved for researchers at a later stage. Cost is just \$10, which goes towards helping to maintain our collection.

Mr Fred Edwards

Mentioned above are details of how you can save for future generations your family's story. We are so lucky here at the museum to hold many such histories written by early pioneers themselves or close family members. In this month's feature we will discover the story of Mr Frederick (Fred) James Edwards, 1884 to 1974, as recorded in his journal, with references to his father's papers. Fred's grandfather Thomas (born 1798) arrived in Geelong in 1849 with his wife Mary and 6 children. Fred's father, James, and another brother, Thomas, followed the gold trail around Ballarat without success before turning to farming in that area.

In 1862 a Bill was passed opening land across the western districts and beyond. In 1874 James and Thomas each took up a 320 acre block at one pound per acre, payable over 10 years in Charlton. With his new wife Elizabeth, James constructed a hut of logs and mud with a canvas roof where they lived for three years before an improved home with a flattened bark roof was made. Several children were born there including Fred, who later attended the Narrewillock School, which had 60 children of pioneering families enrolled. Fred recalls all his good neighbours who were always willing to help each other in times of need.

As a boy he recalled the last dingo shot in the district, the pushing back of emus and kangaroos, and the first appearance of foxes and rabbits in the late 1880's. Later in his life he lamented the loss of emus. native cats. wood mice. curlew. woodpeckers, ground plovers and chatterona brown birds; whose loss he blamed on wild domestic cats and foxes.

Taking over the farm in 1907, and marrying Anne in 1910, occasional years of good harvest were inevitably followed by drought, floods, locust plagues, poor crop and sheep prices. They had five children together. Anne passed away in 1963 while Edward died on December 15, 1974. Fred's legacy of many years as a Shire Councillor, Freemason, the man behind the Community Forest and his many Bowling Club Championships is featured in a new display at the museum. Phone enquiries:

Charlton Forum meets monthly on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 5:30pm. Meetings are open to the public and if interested in attending, please contact one of our members listed below. Meetings follow a strict agenda but in General Business there is an opportunity for individuals and community organisations to raise issues or update us on their activities. A Shire representative is usually present at meetings to update us on issues raised in the past, to report on Shire business relevant to Charlton, and to take note of other issues that need addressing.

Forum members attend a council briefing at least once a year to report on our activities. We receive an operating stipend from Buloke Shire of \$1000 per year, but as this has not been increased for many years, we are presently advocating on behalf of all Forums for an increase.

We also represent Charlton on the Buloke Tourism Board and Carolyn Olive, our Secretary, is currently the secretary of that organisation as well. We actively contribute to a range of tourism initiatives including a new Buloke Tourism website, new town brochures, a revised Buloke Official Visitors Guide, radio campaign on FLOWFM and a proposed Buloke Mounted Machinery Trail for which we are awaiting news on a funding submission.





As I drove past the lake at Boort, I happened to notice a gathering of pelicans, about twenty I would say. They were close together and I pondered what, if there is, the plural for pelicans. Well, what do you know? A group of pelicans is called a pod. But there are others too, a pouch, a scoop, a squadron, or a fleet, if they are fishing. My next thought, and they come in no particular order, was, how reassuring this gathering, this pod, was to see. Not just for the pelicans, but for me. But then, that is the point of gatherings, isn't it? On most occasions, gatherings are reassuring. They can have a defined purpose or intent, but it can also be that the gathering, the being together, is enough on its own to be reassuring. As God's people we are familiar with the joy that comes from gathering. As we commence our worship, the first section in our prayer book is called "Gathering in God's Name". Here we gather to worship, gather to celebrate God's love, to connect, to pray, to give thanks and to be together, just as the disciples gathered, to hear the Word, sing praises, pray and proclaim the Gospel. And as we gather, we share, we support and we affirm our faith alongside others. Let us be reminded of the beauty of gathering and let it lift our hearts.
