Rex Theatre Extension Nearing Completion

As of the end of July the backstage construction at the Rex is now at a stage where the lay-out and definition of spaces is defined, and amenities are currently being fitted.

The toilet area features a décor of dark marbled partitions, with similar styling used on the bench vanities. Walls are white, and a dark grey floor adds to the streamlined and contemporary look. While most of the cubicles were empty at the time of the photos, plumbing fixtures are in place, so the installation of pans will be able to take place quickly.

The monochrome palette is consistent throughout the building with fittings in the Green Room/multifunction room also reflecting the dark/light theme.

While stage access from the new addition is still a "work-in-progress", the entry points are distinguishable on the stage wall, as appears in the accompanying photo as seen from the auditorium.

With the Rex backstage upgrade nearing completion, this exciting addition to Charlton's landmark heritage building is set to reinvigorate the theatre's capacity for both cultural and community offerings.

A re-opening date should be on the cards soon, so patrons, the wait will soon be over!

When you visit the museum you will see a huge variety of items from those used around the household, military items, commercial tools and advertising, photographs, and so much more. The Charlton Golden Grains Museum also boasts a wonderful display of sporting memorabilia, awards and trophies donated over many years. This month we will take a closer look at two such items

Irish Fusiliers vs the Frothblowers

In 1933 when the controversial Bodyline Test Series was the talk of the nation, and Bradman and Larwood were in heated battle, residents of Charlton fought their own unofficial tests. The two teams made up mainly from patrons of the East Charlton

Hotel were the 'Frothblowers' and the 'Irish Fusiliers'. A winner's shield was designed by Charlton jeweller, Mr Harold Barber, and records show that the Frothblowers were too experienced for their opposition. Many names of local families, who still reside in the district today, are listed on the shields. The museum is grateful that in November 1985 Mr Eric Houghton, licensee of the East Charlton Hotel, passed the shield on to Ike Richards, who was a surviving member of the winning team. Ike kindly donated it to the museum. The item was beautifully conserved and reframed in 2012 after it was damaged in the 2011 flood.

The A.I.F Cup

In September the Charlton RSL will again be hosting its very popular 'Diggers Day' golf tournament at the Charlton Golf Club. The museum has on display a magnificent perpetual trophy, The A.I.F. Cup, presented by Mrs K. Luth in 1935 to C.A. Hill of Charlton. It also records the names of other winners up until 1974, when B. Bird of Wychitella was the winner. Available RSL records show that over \$100,000 has been donated by the Charlton RSL Sub-Branch to Bendigo Legacy from the proceeds of Diggers Day—an amazing amount.

Do you have a few hours free each month? The Charlton Golden Grains Museum is always looking for new members to help maintain, archive and assist with our collection and attend during opening hours to the public. No experience is needed and appropriate training will be provided. If you have an interest in history and would like to help preserve items for Charlton's future generations, contact the museum; you will be made most welcome. Another way to help is to become a 'Friend of the Museum' for just \$20. Every dollar goes towards maintaining and improving our town's collection of important historic items.

Have you considered having your family's story recorded for future generations? The Charlton Golden Grains Museum offers a service where we will scan a copy of your documents and photos, and file copies of the originals in an A4 envelope. This is a wonderful opportunity for stories not to be lost, but preserved for researchers of Charlton or even your family at a later stage. Cost is just \$10 which goes towards helping to maintain our collection.

Coffee Growing in Timor Leste

Riani Donaldson and Aurelia Monaghan were guest speakers at the June meeting of Charlton Action for World Development (AWD). Timor Leste is their home country but they both now live in Charlton.

Riani showed a video about coffee growing in Timor Leste. Coffee is Timor's only export. The high altitude provides the right growing conditions. The country is beautiful but the terrain is very rugged. In the video the guide moves like a mountain goat while the narrator struggled, needing a rest and at times a helping hand.

The United States, Australia and New Zealand are the main buyers of Timor's coffee, buying in total over six thousand tons. This is just 1% of the world's coffee. Timor Leste is a poor country and while coffee is their main cash crop the Timor Leste economy depends on oil.

It was fascinating to see how the crop is harvested. The red cherries are picked then you wait eight days and the green cherries will be ready. A good cherry contains two coffee beans. If the cherries are picked too green production fails so there are many factors involved for coffee growing to succeed and many families depend on coffee for their living.

It's not easy. World prices may be low. Heavy rain can destroy the crop, causing the

fruit to fall before it's ripe, and if no crop is harvested the children are taken out of school. In the 'hungry' season when the coffee money runs out corn may be grown.

Coffee was introduced by the Portuguese back in the early nineteenth century. At the time of independence plantations and crops were destroyed but some survived and the people brought them back with care and

hard work.

Australian soldiers, who'd been deployed in Timor during the time of the independence and were deeply affected by what they'd witnessed, wanted to help the people who'd been so welcoming to them. They set up co-operatives to market and sell coffee back home.

Kim Yapp, AWD's vice president, thanked Riani and Aurelia for their presentation. She said it was very interesting and informative. She said when you make yourself a cup of coffee you don't realise how much effort has gone into producing the beans.

Buloke and Loddon Youth Present Bill in Parliament

Five young people from communities across the Buloke and Loddon Shire recently took part in the week-long Victorian Youth Parliament initiative coordinated by the Y (formerly known as the YMCA) which saw them present their draft Sustainability and Carbon Neutrality in Mining Bill 2022 in the Legislative Assembly in Parliament House.

Jake Murphy (Wedderburn), Tyler Riley (Charlton), Mia Braun (Pyramid Hill), Lennon Jablonka (Charlton) and Noah Slater (Donald) were joined by Martina Moshy from the Y to form a six-member team that was responsible for drafting the Bill and then arguing in the House why it should be adopted and turned into legislation.

As the First Bill up for debate on Day One of the week-long experience, each of the six team members spoke on the merits of the bill, and despite the enthusiastic rebuttals of the Opposition, the Bill was passed.

The Buloke Loddon team was in action again later in the week when it was their turn to refute The Red Robins "Rehabilitation in Youth Justice Bill 2022", with all five members again speaking about the inadequacies of the legislation.

Three of the team members also participated in adjournment debates with Jake Murphy addressing the Minister for Education and the Arts about the disadvantages facing rural students regarding the limitations of subject selections, especially in the arts.

Noah Slater addressed the Minister for Regional Development talking about the urban-rural divide and the need to provide a more equitable approach to services and infrastructure across the state, while Lennon Jablonka addressed the Minister for Consumer Affairs, Gambling and Liquor Regulation speaking of the need to set limits on gambling advertising to reduce addiction.

According to Loddon Shire participant Jake Murphy from Wedderburn, Youth Parliament was a learning experience that not only broadened his horizons on the political front, it gave him the opportunity to make life-long friends.

"Now that the event has been and gone and the project is complete, I cannot imagine my life without having done it – what a truly remarkable experience," he said.

Mia Braun from Pyramid Hill also gained much from the experience, describing it as a life-changing opportunity that she would heavily recommend to every young person.

"I had little to no knowledge about politics, didn't know how to make a bill, and had significant public speaking anxiety. Through Youth Parliament I was able to

learn new things, and overcome obstacles but most importantly, make friends and connections that I will never forget and cherish for the rest of my life," she said.

"It has been such an amazing journey throughout these past few months. I wish I could relive all of those everlasting moments that have, and will, replay in my mind when I'm looking back on the best moments of my life," said Mia.

Noah Slater from Donald said Youth Parliament was a great way for the views of young people to be heard by decision makers who will now have access to the 20 Bills presented by the teams, with some to potentially be turned into legislation.

"Being at Parliament House was incredible. We were able to meet members

of both the Government and Opposition during the week and have conversations about topics that are important to us. We'd all love to do it again next year," he said.

Funded through the Victorian Governments Buloke and Loddon Engage! Programs, this is the first time the North Central LLEN has participated in the Victorian Youth Parliament program, which has been going for more than 30 years, providing opportunities for young people (16-25 years) from across the state to stand up and be heard in Parliament Chambers on a range of issues that are important to Victorian Youth.


