After a year of officially being home to Charlton and District Preschool and Maternal and Child Health, Charlton Early Years Centre opened its doors to the community to come and check out their beautiful new home.

One month short of the 60 year anniversary of the previous Charlton & 25^{th} District Preschool's opening on September 1962, the current committee and teachers of the Charlton & District Preschool organised a Community Opening for this new facility on 25th August 2022. In attendance was Mary Walklate, who was instrumental in Charlton gaining its first kindergarten in 1962. Mary was thrilled to be able to finally see what had become the new Charlton Early Years Centre.

To mark the occasion, teacher, Sharon McLean, and President, Rachael Smyth, welcomed those in attendance and thanked the Buloke Shire and State Government for seeing and hearing the need for a new educational home for Charlton's preschool Both Sharon and children. Rachael acknowledged the trials in getting this facility as well as the turbulent couple of years we have experienced that have delayed an official opening.

To make the occasion extra special, a time capsule had been put together by Sharon and fellow educator, Deb Whykes. Included in the time capsule was a current Buloke Times, Charlton Community Newsletter, pictures by each of the current children at the Charlton & District Preschool and a hand-written history of the Charlton & District Preschool by Mary Walklate. The children in attendance helped Sharon to place the time capsule in its resting

place in the playground out the back, to be opened in August 2032.

It was a wonderful morning, seeing many who had been associated with the Charlton & District Preschool in many different ways, enjoy the new Centre and marvel at the new facility.

Rotary Nature Reserve Upgrade

The Rotary Nature Reserve was established in 1984 as the major project for the Rotary Club of Charlton for that year. Lloyd Watts was president and his band of helpers transformed the relatively derelict area into the fauna and flora haven it is today.

The area around the Railway Dam was formerly a horse paddock and the dam itself a shallow uninspiring eyesore.

With Reeves the of help Earthmoving, provided who machinery at cost, the dam was deepened and two islands were pushed up in the middle of the now significant water storages. Over two hundred trees were planted on the islands and the surrounding area; the help of students from the local schools was much appreciated.

After almost 40 years the original signage and seating had fallen into disrepair. As part of the Rotary Centenary Project – an Australia wide recognition of the 100 years of Rotary Service in this country – a new sign and seats have been installed at the reserve.

North Central Garden Club Celebrating 40 Years

The 40th anniversary of the North Central Garden Club saw former and current members gather in Charlton during August to celebrate the milestone achievement and to reminisce on the organization which has brought pleasure to so many.

Held in the Charlton Seniors Citizens' Club, the room was decked out with memorabilia and themed in red in keeping with a Ruby Anniversary. Current members also dressed in red for the occasion.

Welcoming the attendees, NCGC President, Bernice Kenny, acknowledged the attendance of special guest, Lori Emerson, President of The Garden Clubs of Australia, who was accompanied by her husband, George.

Presenting a brief history of the Club (which was formed in October 1982) Bernice related the highlights of the journey which has ensued over the past four decades.

From the well-attended inaugural meeting, at which representatives from the Horticultural Society of Victoria and the Echuca Horticultural Society were also present, the following executive was elected: President, Mrs Dulcie Smale; Vice-Presidents; Mr Peter Nicholls and Miss Pam Churchill; Secretary, Mrs Marjory Nicholls; and Treasurer, Mrs Eleanor Pollard. The meeting was chaired by Cr Maurice Bingham.

Original executive members attending the 40th celebration included Peter and Marjory Nicholls and Pam Towers, with an apology received from Eleanor Pollard.

As the Club evolved membership grew to include the Birchip, Wycheproof, Nullawil and Charlton communities, with meetings alternating between the four towns.

Reflecting on many of the Club's highlights, Bernice listed events such as the Flower Shows, two successful Expos, which drew many visitors, plus guest speakers who had inspired, lots of workshops and excursions which had been enjoyed by all.

The inception of the Open Gardens Day in 2013 has become one of the Club's major drawcards, bringing return visitors from across the state on an annual basis. Held on the second Sunday of October in Charlton, the event showcases local gardens and creates both a great social day, with the flow-on financial success benefitting local organizations and groups. Over the years these have included the Charlton Driver Safety Education Centre (CHARTSEC), East Wimmera Health Service (EWHS) Charlton Campus, Charlton Kinder and the Charlton Community Car.

Beautify Charlton has been the Club's latest project – a multi-partner initiative – including the Buloke Shire, the Bendigo

Community Bank, Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR), along with the service clubs of Rotary, Lions and OASIS. Geared towards enhancing the main streetscapes with more suitable and attractive plantings, the project is continuing towards its final stage despite the interruptions of Covid.

A number of cards congratulating the club on its anniversary were received and read out by Bernice including from Marjory and Peter Nicholls, the Clifton Springs Garden Club, and the Wedderburn Garden Club. A Certificate of Achievement was also presented from The Garden Clubs of Australia.

Following an invitation for any of the original members to speak, Pam Towers spoke of the opportunities of meeting likeminded people and enjoying the various trips, while Marjory Nicholls spoke of the pleasure of seeing the Club continue over such a long period of time, the discussions around choosing the name and the circulation of meetings between the Wycheproof, Charlton, Birchip and Nullawil communities.

A commemoration for members who had passed away over the years was recognized with the placement of a yellow daffodil in a vase (to coincide with Daffodil Day) and a minute's silence.

President of The Garden Clubs of Australia, Lori Emerson, then spoke saying it was a privilege to be at the celebration and that people come to Garden Club "because they love it." This is a feeling that is replicated across the nation in the organization's 773 clubs. "The North Central Garden Club is one of those beautiful affiliates that makes everything so lovely to come along and be with friends," Lori said. Highlighting the special place gardening clubs have in the local communities, Lori congratulated the Club, saying it upholds the GCA motto of *"Friendship Through Gardens"*. She concluded her address with a short story about Gardening Australia presenter, Costa Georgiadis.

The formalities concluded with the cutting of the anniversary cake (and pretend blowing out of the candles due to a lack of matches) by foundation members Peter and Marjory Nicholls.

Pool Table at 'The East' Gets a Facelift

When Greg Towers and Leanne Gretgrix took over the East Charlton Hotel, in November 2021, they inherited an original 1970's pool table that had been well used and seen better days. The decision needed to be made on whether to buy a new pool table or repair and refurbish the old one. Seeing the potential of the old table, Greg enlisted the help of a few locals and friends to help refurbish the table and give it a new life.

First the base had to be cleaned up and with the top off Greg found a few surprises which included a couple of pool balls, most of the levelling blocks were missing and the pocket rubbers were well past their used-bydate. Greg replaced most of the inside which had been damaged by the pub environment, replaced the leveling blocks and sourced new pocket rubbers from an old school friend in Bendigo. A call to Daniel Lane at North Central Smash Repairs to paint the base resulted in a beautiful gloss black table base that you wouldn't know was the same table. The top was stripped and the slate was found in perfect condition, even though it had seen a few dance moves displayed on it over the years. New side cladding was fabricated to replace the old wood grain coloured tin, the felt replaced and a laser level was used to make sure it rolled true.

Now the refurbished table is back in action and patrons can't believe it is the same table. To utilise the refurbished table even more, the East Charlton Hotel has started a Monday Night 8 Ball Knockout Pool competition. It is a \$10 buy in and all of the entry fees go towards the prize pool. All levels of ability are welcome to join in.

It had been a fun year for players, all enjoying their time together on court. 17 & Under A Best and Fairest was won by Isabel Soulsby and 17 & Under A Best and Fairest Runners-up won by Emmersyn Nelson. Annie Olive was awarded Coaches Award for her dedication in defence and desire to improve her game.

2022 Charlton Netball Club Rookie of the Year was awarded to **Tahli Roberts**. Tahli has been a highly valued member of the 17 & Under A team and plays predominantly in goals. She is a reliable focal player in attack for her teammates and displays great skill in and around the goal ring. Tahli has also been a regular player in the B Grade side and has been instrumental in helping them throughout the season. This is Tahli's last season in the junior grades before she steps into the senior grades next year.

C Grade

At the start of the season, it was unclear if there would be a C Grade side. To ensure the girls ready to play in C Grade got the chance and to help the 17 & Under team, who would have a number of rounds with no games, Stacy Dunstan and Rebecca Sexton stepped up to ably take on the role of C Grade coaches.
