Donation Lights Up The Rex

Dynamic lighting effects will now ignite The Rex Theatre stage thanks to a \$2,000 donation from the Charlton NH (Neighbourhood House) Op Shop.

The funds for the purchase of a ChamSys QuickQ 20 Lighting Control Console augmented contributions from the Buloke Shire (\$1000 Community Grant-Small Equipment) and a further \$1000 from the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR) Fundraising Account Partnership for the volunteer-run facility to boost its stage lighting capabilities.

The easy to manoeuvre QuickQ 20 offers user-friendly applications for dimming, colour fixing and the manipulation of moveable light heads and is aimed at a novice level entry for students, volunteers and part-time users.

Designed for managing contemporary lighting fixtures, the console has a range of labour-saving techniques which help the programmer design a successful show. Built-in Wi-Fi enables remote connections with the QuickQ app, and combined with MagicQ software the ability to control full lighting visualizations and pixel mapping with up to 256 universal lighting control features is available.

Chair of The Rex, Hayden McKinnon thanked Charlton NH Op Shop Manager, Gill Gretgrix, for the generous contribution, saying the equipment will now allow for more complex lighting to be utilised - not just for Rex performances, but for other community events as well.

"The Rex has already successfully used the console for the recent Lyster Opera performance of "The Italian Girl in Algiers," said Hayden, "and our young projectionist, Dominic Calabro has navigated his way around the equipment with relative ease. And for events such as Carols by Candlelight, this console will enable us to create something special to enhance the atmosphere of the evening."

The Charlton NH Op Shop has a long been a supporter of the "community", with Manager, Gill saying they are always keen to see funds go back into boosting

community development.

For now, The Rex will be hard at work discovering the potential of its new apparatus and are looking forward to elevating the theatrical experience for theatre-goers.

Bernie McLoughlan, formerly of Wooroonook, has recently returned from representing Australia in the 2024 World Masters Athletics Championships in Gothenburg, Sweden.

The brother of Wooroonook farmers, Jeff and Leo McLoughlan, Bernie won a silver medal in the 6000m Cross Country team event with two other Australian runners in the M70-74 Age Group. Competing in a range of other events over the two weeks of competition, Bernie won heats of the 400m and 1500m in the demanding two day Decathlon event. He reached the semi-finals of the 400m and narrowly missed reaching the finals of both the 800m and 400m.

As one of over 150 Australian athletes competing at international level, with 8,000 other athletes from over 200 countries, it was a great experience for Bernie. He is an active member of the Doncaster Athletic Club and currently holds State and National titles in his age group.

Among his upcoming events are the Victorian Masters Championships early in 2025, before attempting to defend his M70-74 Australian Champion status in the 200m and 400m in Adelaide at Easter.

Robert Ruse

This month we are going to look back at the life of one of Charlton's earlier residents and business owners; Mr Robert Ruse J.P. When you enter many community, sporting or local government buildings you commonly walk past large wooden honour boards with the names of long since past members of the Charlton community.

Like today, every name tells the story of an interesting life and often one who played an important part of our local history. Robert Ruse was born in Sturmer, Essex County, England in 1834 and arrived in aboard the sailing 'Calvadera' in 1855. The voyage lasted 98 days and was uneventful apart from the presence of large icebergs off the Cape of Good Hope. Like tens of thousands of others Robert was on the search for gold and headed with his heavy swag firstly to Blackwood, just past Bacchus Marsh, then Fiery Creek where a new discovery was drawing attention. After limited success on his claim he tried other sites at Beechworth and The Ovens, and finally decided to give up the venture and return to Melbourne.

Working back as his trade of a saddler. Robert was soon keen to journey again to the new gold discovery area of Castlemaine, but decided to continue working as a saddler rather than prospector. Staying there for two years he was lured by gold to Bendigo and Ararat but again fortune refused to smile. Returning to Melbourne he joined the Police Force and was employed as a saddler for the gold field escorts, later being transferred to Ballarat, buying a smelting and furnace business in Sebastopol in 1873.

Again good luck eluded him as the price of iron ore fell sharply and the costs of furnace coal rose sharply. The balance sheet ,after several years of operation, was disappointing and Robert decided it was time to settle down buying 320 acres of land at Wycheproof in 1876.

In 1880 he purchased a saddlery business in Charlton from Mr G. Powell and remained in the same premises until his death in 1922. He always took a great interest in town affairs and was part of an influential group of citizens campaigned vigorously for a compact Charlton Shire in 1884. He was Secretary of

the Charlton Turf Club for 35 years, as well as holding positions on the Cemetery Trust, Rifle Club. Mechanics Institute. Agricultural Society and Foundation Member of The Charlton Club. He was also the Returning Officer Elections State and Justice of the Peace. After a long illness of five years, following a stroke, Robert passed away to the combined sadness of the district. He was a man liked by everyone, always cheerful and optimistic and commonly known as 'The Grand Old Man'. He was buried in the grave of his late wife at the Charlton General Cemetery following a by service Father Gleeson.





Mark 11:12-26 [Jesus said,] 'When you stand and pray, forgive anything you may have against anyone, so that your Father in heaven will forgive the wrongs you have done'. (verse 25)






