# 'Country' Theme Headlines Pacing Cup

The 2025 Charlton Pacing Cup homed in on all things rural with the theme "We're All Country" as patrons responded with gusto at the 16<sup>th</sup> March premier meet of the year.

The social opening began at 11am with the well supported "Bubbles in the Bush" an initiative which raises funds for research into ovarian cancer and runs in conjunction with Team Teal through the harness racing fraternity. Founded by racing enthusiast, Duncan McPherson OAM, the cause is a tribute to his wife Lyn who passed away from ovarian cancer in 2010.

The Charlton Harness Racing Club's original "Bubbles" event was aimed at drawing more women to race day while also using the opportunity to shine a light on women's health. The Club developed a strong partnership with St John of God Hospital Bendigo (SJOG) and this has continued over the years representatives attending and sharing outreach and information about the evolution of medical responses to women's cancer journeys. This year's guest speaker, Claire Pysing (Nurse Manager - Day Oncology Unit) was once again on hand to share updates with the crowd on a range of developments introduced over the past twelve months.

# Golden Grains Museum News

April has already rolled around and it's another

update from your Charlton Golden Grains Museum. Opening every Sunday from 11:00am until 3:00pm or at other times by request, we have been pleased to have welcomed many visitors from a wide variety of places. Admittance is still a very low \$5, and free for children with EFTPOS being available. Our museum could be an ideal venue for your group or organisation wishing to have an interesting outing. Group tours of all sizes are most welcome, and a cuppa and biscuits could accompany your visit. Consider for something different having your meeting then a wander around the venue.

The Charlton Golden Grains Museum is always looking for new volunteers to help maintain, archive and assist with our collection and attend during opening hours to the public. If you have an interest in local history and would like to help preserve Charlton's story contact one of the names listed below; you will be made most welcome by our friendly team. You could give as much time as you wish and don't need any experience; training will be provided. Becoming a 'Friend of the Museum' for just \$20 also assists in us continuing our work preserving local history.

### The Depression

Our feature this month looks at the early Depression Years of 1931-35. As a child 1 heard stories from my grandmother of the terrible times Australia and the world experienced during the depression. She recalled men going door to door offering to do odd jobs for the price of a warm meal. Grandma was lucky enough to have work in the Hoadley's confectionary factory in Melbourne, and recalled how it was common practice for the girls to cake chocolate onto their aprons and scrape it off at home. Charlton wasn't exempt from the hardship of those years with the council reporting 10,500 pounds owing in overdue rates and a severe drop in the population from over 3,000 to 1,360. Many small farms, especially the Soldier Settlers, had been forced off the land due to falling prices and rising costs. For many the only income were government subsistence payments, while the CWA, RSL and local churches formed a committee to administer funds to needy families. A government initiative of a pound for pound relief grant was taken up with proviso that it must be spent on labour programs. Concrete paving was laid in High and Learmonth Streets with the CWA and RSL contributing one third of the cost for Learmonth Street. A further grant of 2,300 pounds was received in 1933 to repair flood damaged roads in the Shire. In 1935 another grant was received to clear the Avoca River of fallen timber on the condition that 16 of the 27 workers were to be unemployed

married men from Melbourne. The work gang was accommodated in tents in what is now Gordon Park and had meals provided on site.

### **Glenloth Bus Tour**

Look for our promotion for a Glenloth Bus Tour (Sunday May 4th). We'll take you on a trip to look at Glenloth, Teddywaddy and finish up at the historic Cobham Hall for afternoon tea.

### **Wesley Chapel Renovations**

Further renovations are underway of the back room of the Wesley Chapel. This room was in a sorry state and Gary Bateson and Rod Heritage have been working hard to repair years of deterioration. This room will house our planned medical display. We look forward to an official opening later in the year.

### Preserve your family's history.

Have you thought about having your family's story recorded for future generations? Our museum has a popular service where you can record your history for us to scan into our digital reference library, and store a copy of the papers, family images or genealogy charts in an A4 size envelope. This is a wonderful opportunity for stories not to be lost, but preserved for researchers at a later stage. Cost is a very low \$10, which goes towards helping to maintain our collection.

# 'Country' Theme Headlines Pacing Cup

Before Claire's address, the morning session was opened by event coordinators Leanne Fanning (a cancer survivor herself) and Bec Heenan giving a welcome to all and a recap on the amazing grand total of \$50,000 which "Bubbles" has raised since its inception. An emotional Leanne said, "As a survivor I know how incredibly grateful I am, along with the thousands of other women – both young and old - who also benefit from this research."

Thanking major sponsor, St. John of God Bendigo, Leanne also acknowledged the many helpers volunteering their time for fund-raising activities on the day. From purchasing tickets for the raffle and the spinning wheel, placing a signature on the silent auction sheets, buying a teal ribbon or placing a bid during the live auction, patrons' generosity was dedicated towards finding answers in the ongoing quest to treat cancer.

### ST JOHN OF GOD BENDIGO

A regular representative of SJOG, Claire Pysing's address was particularly significant this year as she herself had undergone treatment (successfully) for breast cancer. Noting SJOG's affiliation with "Bubbles" since 2018, Claire revealed the statistics for cancer in 2024 came in at almost 170,000 diagnoses, with around 52,700 of these resulting in death. Emphasizing the importance of cancer research, which has improved statistics

from 68% to 70% over the past seven years, Claire outlined the facility's capacity to offer treatments five days a week, and said they were pleased to welcome Dr Amy Davies, whose experience in treating organ cancers and ongoing academic research was a significant boost to the team. McGrath Breast Care Nurse Consultant, Shanya Beattie, was also acknowledged for her supportive and informative work.

The additional implementation of three new services in 2024 included: the "Joy" program, which provides a low-cost option for families to access private maternity care; the Cardiac Assessment Unit, which provides life-saving intervention and care for people who suffer heart conditions or chest pain and the Wig Library, to help people with cancer.

Claire also acknowledged the Charlton Lions Club which was one of the many donors supporting the purchase of the \$2.5 million Da Vinci Xi surgical robot which performed its first surgery on 12 March.

In concluding her address Claire said, "I hope that one day we will find a cure for cancer. It's events like these that will help us to achieve that goal."

### RISING STAR OF HARNESS RACING

An interview with the upcoming female harness racing driver, Abby Sanderson - conducted by Frank McGrath - gave an insight into the background of this young sportswoman, who is now based at

Murchison after the family's move from Charlton.

Showing a prodigious beginning in this sporting code, nineteen-year-old Abby has already clocked up a win in the \$100,000 VHRC Caduceus Club Classic at Melton in 2023, along with being the youngest harness racing driver to win the prestigious \$50,000 Mildura Pacing Cup in 2024 after her brother Ryan won the same race the previous year.

With a life-long love of horses fueling thoughts of an equine based career, Abby also shared the commitment needed for a normal race day itinerary which starts early in the morning and often doesn't finish until late at night if travelling for races. She also acknowledged the vibrant harness racing scene in Charlton.

### A NEW INITIATIVE

As the morning progressed a replacement for the Fashions on the Field saw the introduction of the "Country Lady of the Day" award. The inaugural winner, Kristy O'Gorman was announced along with four spot prize winners including Beck Maddocks (Moyston), Tia Fanning, Marea Judd and Stella Nicolson. Winners of the silent auction were also announced before John Tormey and Kevin Thompson launched into the all-important live auction. With items ranging from a pizza oven through to accommodation packages, vouchers, hair and beauty services, fine

After Parade Dismiss, RSL members and the general public will enter the Hall for the formal ceremony.

At the completion of the ceremony, all are invited into the RSL clubrooms adjoining the Hall to reflect on this One

# All Conquering Mozart

The Lyster Opera Company made a welcome return to Charlton's Rex Theatre on 29<sup>th</sup> March with Mozart's three act opera, "The Abduction from the Seraglio".

Proving that if the opportunity presents people will follow, an enthusiastic crowd of locals, visitors and travellers from beyond made a sizable audience which showed their appreciation for the singing and musical talents needed to present this vocally challenging work.

While encompassed in a relatively simple story, love, passion, plus a touch of humour were the underpinning themes, while the denouement of forgiveness was what elevated the plot to bring about the finale of happy outcomes for the principal couples, if not for some of the secondary characters.

A dual cast of the main characters – including suitors, Belmonte and Pedrillo, and their intendeds, Konstanze and Blonde – are alternated across this 2025 Lyster season as the production tours smaller centres across regional Victoria. The other roles of Osmin, Pasha Selim (non singing) and the chorus of four singers remain unchanged for all performances.

Given the singing demands on the four principals, along with the opportunity to explore this work's vocal diversity, it's understandable that the casting is shared across a number of performers. Speaking after the show on Saturday the cast talked about the energy expended in the singing and all were looking forward to unwinding in town overnight before heading back to Melbourne the next day.

Pianist Kevin Tamanini showcased his extensive accompanist skills on the Steinway concert grand piano, effortlessly working through the demanding Mozart

score which was broken up with short bursts of dialogue. The Rex's good fortune to have the Steinway on loan from locals Robert Cripps and Dana Czarski has surprised many visiting artists - including the Lyster cast - who were amazed to see the gold standard instrument in a small country town.

An outstanding and innovative set by designer Blair Parkinson captured the essence of the Turkish scene setting with colourful and easily maneuverable panels which could be enhanced with a few props or merely turned around to change the view.

The opulent costuming by Maddy Connellan (a costume designer with experience in many of the biggest musicals) captured both the historical era and the lavishness of the Ottoman era, with the rich colours striking out against the background panels.

With a young, but very experienced cast

whose bios revealed the scope of their training and professional transitions, this was a musical delight for those who appreciate opera and for those who are at an entry-level to the art form. Mozart's opera was meant to "captivate, charm and entertain", and this was certainly in evidence at the March 29 performance.

The Rex acknowledges the liaison with Lyster Director, Jamie Moffat and the support shown by Rachel Buckley in spreading the word about The Rex as an entertainment venue. It was also pleasing to welcome Lyster's major sponsor - Henkell Brothers Investment Partners —with Mr. Hans Henkell again attending at this year's event

The Rex looks forward to a continuing partnership with Lyster Opera into the future.

"You are my God, and I give Thinking leads to Thanking you thanks; I will proclaim your greatness. Give thanks to the Lord, because he is good and his love is eternal." Psalm 118:1,2,19-29

Martin Luther, who was a 16th-century monk and theologian, was one of the most significant figures in Christian history. His beliefs helped begin the Reformation, which would introduce new religious, political, and economic paths to the world. Martin had a special love for this psalm. He wrote, "This is my psalm, my chosen psalm. I love them all; I love all holy Scripture, which is my consolation and my life. But this psalm is nearest my heart, and I have a peculiar right to call it mine. It has saved me from many a pressing danger, from which nor emperor, nor kings, nor sages, nor saints, could have saved me. It is my friend; dearer to me than all the honours and power of the earth".

So what is this Psalm all about – curious? Read on then. Well, it begins and ends the same – with a call to give thanks to God whose love never ends. And don't miss verse 17, "I will not die; instead I will live" which was fulfilled at Easter. And this great event (hear about this at Easter), confirmed that Jesus, who was the stone that the builders rejected as worthless, turned out to be the most important of all (verse 22).

Thoughtlessness leads to thanklessness. (If we do not think about God and Jesus, then when do we thank them?) If we do not make the connection this limits our view so that we miss seeing God around us, in where we are and where we are going. Remembering and recalling all the good things that we enjoy from day to day will give us opportunity to thank God. A prayer that I use for grace, before I eat, is applicable for all throughout my day. "Give thanks to the Lord, because he is good and his love is eternal". The ultimate reason for thanks though, is that God gave his only Son to save us and to have victory over sin and death. Give thanks INDEED!!! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia.

A Prayer for you to offer: Gracious God, give me a grateful heart. Let me show my thankfulness by living not for my own honour but to your glory. Through your Son Jesus we pray. Amen. 0435 593 359 Reverend Judi Bird




