Courthouse Gallery a Patchwork of Colour & Creativity

The Charlton Courthouse Gallery was very busy over the June long weekend as visitors poured in for *Pieced Together* -ACollaboration of Charlton & District *Quilters*.

Despite chilly temperatures and the 'welcome' rain, people travelled from across the district to see the exhibition — a testament to the dedication of quilters and their love of sharing and celebrating each other's work.

It was the first time the historic Courthouse Gallery has hosted a quilt exhibition, and for many visitors it was also

their first time stepping inside the beautifully restored building. The gallery's high walls and charming interior made the perfect backdrop for the vibrant display of quilts.

Guests were impressed by the range of work on show — from traditional patterns to contemporary designs — and the skill and creativity behind each piece. While the walls were adorned with quilts of every style and size, every other surface was also covered with patchwork pieces and textile creations.

Carolyn Gallery secretary, Olive, contributed a couple of her own quilts. "I haven't made a quilt for quite a while," she said, "but being surrounded by all the beautiful quilts has inspired me to dig out my stash of fabric and get sewing again.'

Exhibition coordinator Jodie Quinn said the response exceeded expectations. "We're thrilled with the turnout and the fact that people travelled from far and wide to visit. The local quilters really enjoyed seeing their work on display. We may have to do it again — but next time we might need a bigger venue!"

Jenny Pollard Retrospective Opening in August at Charlton Courthouse Gallery

The Charlton Courthouse Gallery will come alive with colour, wit and creativity this August as it hosts a major retrospective of the work of local artist and storyteller, Jenny Pollard. The exhibition opens officially on Sunday 3rd August at 2pm, with all art lovers, family and friends invited to attend.

While many will know Jenny as a long-time correspondent and photographer for the *Buloke Times* or for her iconic mural in the Charlton Shire Hall, this exhibition offers a much broader glimpse into her remarkable creative journey.

Spanning decades and a multitude of mediums, Jenny's work ranges from expressive life drawings and whimsical cartoons to abstract collages, textile pieces and large-scale murals. Her distinctive style is playful, thoughtful and deeply personal, often blending technical skill with a strong sense of narrative and humour.

"We are really looking forward to showcasing Jenny's vast array of work," says Courthouse Gallery Secretary, Carolyn Olive. "Her creativity has touched so many areas of our community – this is a wonderful chance to see it all in one place."

Jenny's formal training in art and design, combined with her wide-ranging interests – from photography and silversmithing to cake decorating and digital design – has resulted in a body of work that is both diverse and deeply engaging. Whether through a finely inked cartoon or a bold brushstroke mural, her ability to capture the quirks and character of life shines through.

1984 Bridal Parade

Our feature story this month takes us back to March 23, 1984, and the Charlton Hospital Ladies' Auxiliary Bridal Parade. Held at the Shire Hall in Armstrong Street, this event was tightly organized as there were 75 gowns featured on the night, with many of the ladies involved on the night still in and around Charlton.

Models were given precise times to arrive at the adjacent RSL building with their frocks in a clearly marked suitcase, and then split up into allocated groups and allotted times to prepare to parade. Behind the scenes six teams of ladies were organised to dress the brides at the allotted time and others to undress and store the frocks back into their cases, with all dresses and veils having to be clearly named to avoid any possible mix-ups.

It was a long night for all involved with the first group of models getting dressed at 7:15pm, while models 58 to 75 dressed at 10:15pm. It wasn't only the 75 bridal gowns on display. An additional 36 Bridesmaids, Matrons of Honour and Flower Girls also accompanied many of the models on the evening adding to the back room organization. A raffle was held to raise additional funds for the hospital with a 20 piece Arcopal Dinner Set as the major prize. Tickets were 20 cents each or 6 for \$1.00.

Year 10 & 11 Exams:

At the start of the month our Year 10 and 11 students began their mid-year exams, an important milestone in their academic Students have been working journey. diligently in the lead-up to these exams, engaging in revision sessions, seeking teacher feedback, and honing their study techniques. The exams cover a wide range of subjects across core and elective areas, testing students' understanding, critical thinking, and application of key concepts. Exams can be a stressful time, but with good preparation and a positive mindset, they can also be a rewarding one.

Somers Camp:

Four of our Year 6 students embarked on an exciting 9-day journey at Somers Camp! They took part in a wide range of outdoor and creative activities, including Boating, Archery, Drama, Art, Environmental Studies, Bushcraft, Orienteering, Rope Swimming/Surfing Courses, (weather permitting), Rock Climbing, Abseiling, Flying Fox, and the Challenge Swing. The fun didn't stop when the sun went downwith evening activities such as Night Hikes, Bush dance, Concert Nights, Disco, Games Nights, and a classic Campfire experience.

Year 10 Driver Education:

Our Year 10 students headed over to CHARTSEC, swapping the classroom for the driver's seat as part of the Driver Education program. For many, it was their first time behind the wheel — and a big step toward learning to drive safely and confidently. They covered road rules, hazard awareness, and how to make good decisions on the road. The highlight for many was the practical driving session with qualified instructors — a great confidence boost before getting their Ls. Thank you to the CHARTSEC team for guiding the way!

On June 17th students undertaking VCE units 3 & 4 sat the General Achievement Test (GAT), a key component of the VCE assessment process. The GAT is designed to assess general knowledge and skills in written communication, mathematics, science, technology, the arts, and humanities. It is a compulsory test for all students enrolled in one or more VCE or scored VCE VET Unit 3 and 4 subjects.

While the GAT does not directly contribute to a student's study scores, it plays a crucial role behind the scenes. GAT results are used to help verify the accuracy of school-based and external assessments and can also be considered in the case of Derived Examination Scores if a student is unable to sit an exam or is affected by illness or other factors.

Year 11 & 12 Retreat:

The Year 11 and 12 students embarked on an unforgettable two-night retreat at the picturesque Creswick Log Cabin Homestead. They arrived just in time for a delicious butter chicken dinner, followed by a spirited and fun-filled game of spoons that set the tone for the evening.

Throughout the retreat, VM students dedicated their time to thoughtfully planning an exciting upcoming project, while VCE students immersed

themselves in focused study habit workshops to sharpen their academic skills.

They completed some exhilarating teambuilding challenges — from the daring leap of faith and balancing act of milk crate stacking to the adrenaline-pumping giant slingshot, clip and climb, and the thrilling zipline ride. These activities not only pushed their limits but also strengthened camaraderie and teamwork across the group.

Our General Meeting held on 13th June went smoothly even with a last minute change of venue to the Uniting Church Hall. There were 36 members present. Happy Birthday was sung to Bev Mulholland, David Beaty, Marj Bartlett and Joan Mundy. Wendy Vandenelst and Ray Aisbett amused us with some jokes. Pat Mathews is leading the Footy Tipping with 78 correct tips followed by Pam Rosewall on 74.

Margaret Byrne gave a two minute talk about author Robyn Howarth who spoke in Donald recently. On Friday 6th October 1972 two masked men burst into the Faraday school room and kidnapped the young female teacher and 6 female students, Robyn being one of those students. Robyn spoke about the horrors they went through. Counselling was unheard of at that time but a few years back Robyn undertook counselling and can now hear the word 'Faraday' without trembling.

Our Guest Speaker was Doug Gretgrix who spoke about his involvement with Harness Racing. He was pestered by Matt Donaldson and his brother Stanley, both trainers, to join the committee which he did in 1979 and immediately became the Assistant Starter in the local area. In 1980 Doug started his first race meeting. The mobile barrier in those days was primitive compared to the computerised version today.

In 1987 Harness Racing Victoria called for starters. There was a starter in Echuca and Horsham and Doug was

appointed to do the area in between but when the roster came out one of the first places he was listed for was Geelong. Sometimes he was in Melbourne as a back up starter. There are 28 clubs in the state and within 3 or 4 years he had started at most tracks.

His next goal was to be starter at the A. G. Hunter Cup – the biggest standing start race in Australia at that time. He achieved this goal in 2009.

In 2017 Doug was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal which is presented to those within the industry who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to serve Victorian Harness Racing. Some people Doug mentioned were Kerryn Manning as a driver at only 17 years of age and Gavin Lang – the best male driver Doug has seen. Doug mentioned Jane Bunn and Danny Frawley as two of the celebrities who have ridden in the back of the mobile. Many local people have also had this experience.

Harness Racing Victoria is currently finding it hard to stay afloat. Charlton used have 16 meetings a year but has been cut back to 12. In two years' time there will be no harness racing in the afternoon and it would cost \$2m - \$3m to put lights at Charlton. Charlton has a great Training Centre and is one of the best clubs – set up well and very friendly.

Harness Racing Victoria has recently released the upcoming season racing dates for all of Victoria and unfortunately for many clubs, Charlton included, it is reflective of the difficulties facing the industry at present. Drastic change has already taken place, particularly the drop in prizemoney, so it is a very difficult period for participants to negotiate and stay positive.

Some 40 plus meetings have been cut from the previous calendar with many clubs having to take a reduction in the number of meetings they run. Charlton has been reduced from 16 to 12 and will run predominantly on Mondays.

Community Bank Charlton and District Charlton Cup Day will be run on Sunday 15th March 2026.

Many factors have come into play with this major restructure of the industry, some of which include horse numbers, TV access, drop in breeding, and at which clubs turnover is most profitable. As HRV strives to realign the industry for a sustainable future, the Charlton HRC Committee will continue to support our local trainers and create ways in which our club remains a vibrant part of regional harness racing.







Bridging Now to Next - from little things big things grow

"I Corinthians 12:13. "Some of us are Jews, some are Gentiles, some are slaves, and some are free. But we have all been baptised into one body by one Spirit"

Australia recently celebrated nationally Reconciliation Week, starting on 27 May – (which commemorates the successful 1967 referendum) and finishing on 3 June (which commemorates the High Court Mabo decision). I am always telling people about the power of prayer. Here are two great examples:

<u>Example One:</u> National Reconciliation Week (NRW) started as the Week of Prayer for Reconciliation in 1993 (the International Year of the World's Indigenous Peoples), with the support of Australian Churches. (through prayer and leadership!!) As NRW grew beyond Churches to become a cross-sector initiative, the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation launched Australia's first National Reconciliation Week in 1996. In 2001 Reconciliation Australia was established to continue to provide national leadership on reconciliation. And here we are in 2025, continuing to bridge now to next, to where we as a nation are truly reconciled with our First Nations peoples.

Example Two: This is taken from resources provided for Reconciliation Week. Aunty Dr Rose Elu wrote after being asked, "What courageous person inspires you and why? Bishop Mariann Edgar Budde was the preacher at the ecumenical prayer service at Washington National Cathedral on 21 January 2025, after the inauguration of the American President. Following what had been a divisive election campaign, she encouraged prayer for unity, naming the foundations of unity as honouring the inherent dignity of every human being, honesty, and humility. Bishop Mariann concluded by addressing the President with a plea for mercy for gay, lesbian and transgender children and that the humanity of immigrants as "good neighbours" be recognised rather than treating them as criminals. I was deeply moved as I watched this gently, but nonetheless strongly, spoken sermon.

This courageous act taught me how one can draw on the resources of faith to communicate the gospel in a profound act of leadership by bearing public witness to God's love for all people. Moments of bravery like this come from a steady and steadfast journey of faith. Bishop Mariann stood with the churches in her diocese as they provided water and sanctuary to Black Lives Matter protesters in 2020. In 2023 Budde, published "How we learn to be brave: Decisive moments in life and faith". In this she explores how being brave is not a singular occurrence, but a daily choice and she illustrates this with stories from scripture, popular culture and personal experience.

It is very important for Christians to be courageous and proclaim God's love to those who may only otherwise hear of God's condemnation.

Prayer: Give us grace to travel together, bridging now to next, towards reconciliation for the sake of Jesus Christ. **Amen.**




