Ambulance Charlton Community Officer (ACO) David Pollard was awarded a 3rd clasp for the National Medal at the recent Ambulance Victoria Loddon Mallee Region Staff Recognitions Awards held at the All Seasons Resort in Bendigo.

The medal, which recognizes diligent long service in organisations that protect life and property at some risk to their members, is conferred only by nomination and only after fifteen years of service. Clasps are available for each additional ten year period, but again are only conferred through nomination. David's third clasp denotes a 45 year period which also incorporates his 35 year service to the CFA for which the National Medal was originally conferred.

In introducing the awards evening, Director Regional and Clinical Operations Loddon Mallee, Matt McCrohan thanked responders for their work and families for their support in dealing with the disruptions which being a paramedic brings to home-life.

In presenting David's award Matt outlined the scope of contributions in the following citation.

A First Responder since joining Ambulance Victoria in 1993, David's outreach has extended well beyond the call

Holding a representative role on the First Responder State Forums for many, many years, along with more recently playing a leading role in the Heart Safe Program in his home-town of Wycheproof, David has also volunteered with the Charlton and District Ambulance Auxiliary for over thirty years, and is currently the president.

Helping raise crucial funds healthcare equipment and facilities for local outlets, David has promoted health

education issues and fostered a sense of community in health-related matters.

additional David's Listing community involvement including his terms as a Councilor and Mayor

of the Buloke Shire and his forty years of volunteering at Charlton's Rex Theatre, Matt said: "His contribution to the community, and clearly with AV is well beyond and is an outstanding achievement. Congratulations David."

Another familiar face at the Charlton AV Branch is paramedic Matt Brown who also received a 15 year Service Medal, 20 Year Service Medal, 20 Year Safe Driving plaque and was nominated for a National Medal (no clasps) for his 15 years of service.

ACO Dede Williams from Wedderburn who occasionally carries out a shift at the Charlton AV Branch - was the recipient of a Peer Excellence Award for Clinical Excellence and Leadership.

The evening also saw the presentation of 8 Graduate Certificates, along with the Best Care story in which a patient and First Responder shared their unique story of twice being brought together in a critical care situation.

Given the large geographical area covered by the Loddon Mallee Region award presentations were held at the major centres of both Bendigo and Mildura.





Golden Grains Museum News

Can you believe it is September already? Before we know it Christmas will be here and the year passed us by. Even at the museum we are already planning activities for 2026! A very exciting project coming up shortly is our Victorian Collections Workshop on September 24. We will be hosting visitors from AMaGA who will be giving volunteers guidance in digitizing our collection and listing it on their website, Victorian Collections.

Looking for something to do on a Sunday? Maybe you have visitors to town or haven't seen our collection for a while. The Charlton Golden Grains Museum is open every Sunday from 11:00am until 3:00pm, or by prior arrangements with one of the volunteers listed below. Please give as much notice as possible to arrange your visit outside of normal opening times. Admittance is still a very low \$5, and free for children with EFTPOS available. Group tours for clubs and organizations are most welcome, and a cuppa and biscuit could easily be arranged.

Flood & Fire

This month we feature a sadder look back in time. While natural disasters are no strangers to the district, 1909 was a year locals longed to forget. In August an already waterlogged countryside received the equivalent of 2 inches of rain in a short period of time. A warning was received by telegram from St Arnaud that heavy flood water was passing down the Avoca River, and within a short period of time a knee deep stream was flowing down High Street. While many horses and cows were moved to higher ground, many hundreds of sheep were lost along with a number of mud dwellings and sheds.

By December though, a good harvest was expected with the crops heavy with grain. An unexplained blaze started at Granite Flat, and fuelled by a fiery hot north wind, raced incredibly fast through Wooroonook to West Charlton leaving a trail of destruction in its path. The fire was finally brought under control with a wind change at the time it had reached Teddywaddy West. A pioneer of the district, Mr Wilson Seward, was burnt to death while trying to save possessions from the fire. In all 24 properties were affected with 5000 bags of wheat, 2700 acres of standing crops, numerous haystacks, machinery and shedding was lost.

Work continues on the Wesley Chapel in preparation for our new medical display. We have finished painting and are now sealing the floor.

Cost is just \$10 which goes towards helping to maintain our collection.

Although the first Catholic Church in Charlton was built in 1875 it wasn't until 1885 that the Charlton Mission was

established and St Joseph's became a Parish. In 1985 St Joseph's celebrated its centenary and on Sunday 26th October we will celebrate 140 years since the establishment of the Parish with Mass and a lunch to follow.

Charlton had its own Parish Priest until the year 2000 when Fr Paul Mercovich became Parish Priest of Charlton and St Arnaud. Then in 2018 Catholic parishes in Wycheproof and

Nullawil, Birchip, Donald, Charlton and Wedderburn, Boort, and St Arnaud and Banyena districts, combined to create a

new parish, now called East Wimmera Parish.

SPRING FIREWOOD COLLECTION IS ON

The spring firewood collection season is now open.

Spring collection period: 1 September – 30 November 2025. Firewood collection is not allowed outside these dates.

A permit is required to collect firewood from roadsides in Buloke Shire. Penalties apply for non-compliance. Apply on council's website: www.buloke.vic.gov.au/ collection-of-firewood.

Maps for designated collection areas in state forests are now live at ffm.vic.gov.au.

PROTECTING OUR TOWNSHIPS

Buloke Shire Council, in partnership with the CFA, is working to reduce fire risk around our townships. If your property borders a township, now is the time to act. What You Need to Do:

- Create firebreaks inside your fence line along property boundaries.
- Do not clear roadside reserves without a permit — contact Council or RRV for permission.
- · Urban properties next to rural land must:
- Clear flammable undergrowth and grass to 100mm height
- · Brush cut along boundaries
- Maintain fire-safe conditions throughout the Fire Danger Period

Rural Fringe Properties (farm, industrial, commercial) must follow CFA's Grassland Interface Project guidelines to reduce radiant heat exposure to dwellings.

Inspections begin in October Council's Fire Prevention Officers will inspect township boundary properties. If your land poses a fire risk, you'll receive a notice with required works.
